These projections are based on the best information currently available. To date, we have not received final figures from the state relative to our pension obligation or state aid. Of course, we also have not completed expenditures for 2008.

To exercise good financial management for the long term, the tax levy indicated above should not be reduced. We will have the opportunity to reduce *appropriations* as we move forward through the budget process, but we must use any such reductions to better our surplus position for 2009.

In November, presentations to council will be made by the administration's department heads on their respective operations, including current and future initiatives, and areas of concern.

Also in November, in accordance with state law, department heads will make their budget requests to the Mayor in open public sessions.
