



Sea Isle City

- Beach Replenishment Project
 - Cost: \$6 Million
- City of Sea Isle City South Beach
- Approximately 700,000 Cubic Yards of Sand

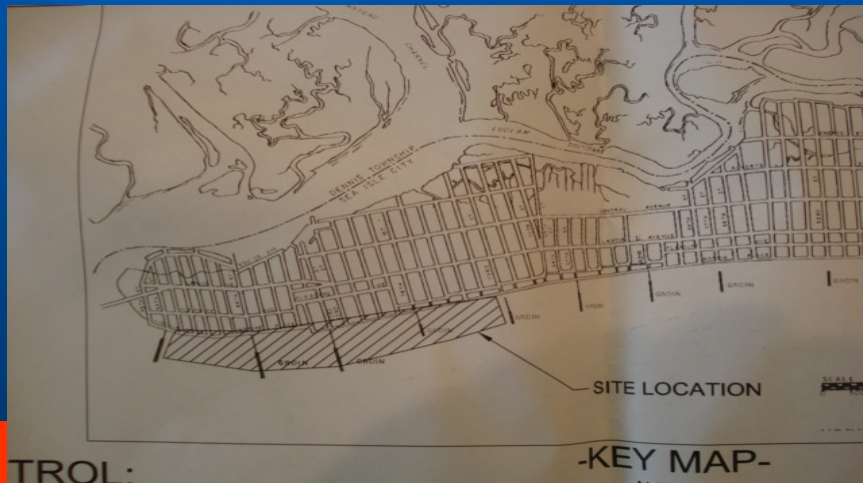
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- **Joint venture with Avalon (they will be replenishing approximately 500,000 cubic yards of sand). By partnering on this project each community saved one million dollars in mobilization costs, along with an estimated savings on the unit cost of sand (estimated at one dollar per cubic yard)**
 - **Rebuild the Public Beach on the Southern End of the City**
 - **Project scheduled to begin in May and be completed by July 4th**
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- Provide for critical shore protection; enable re-growth of the dunes
- Provide recreational benefit

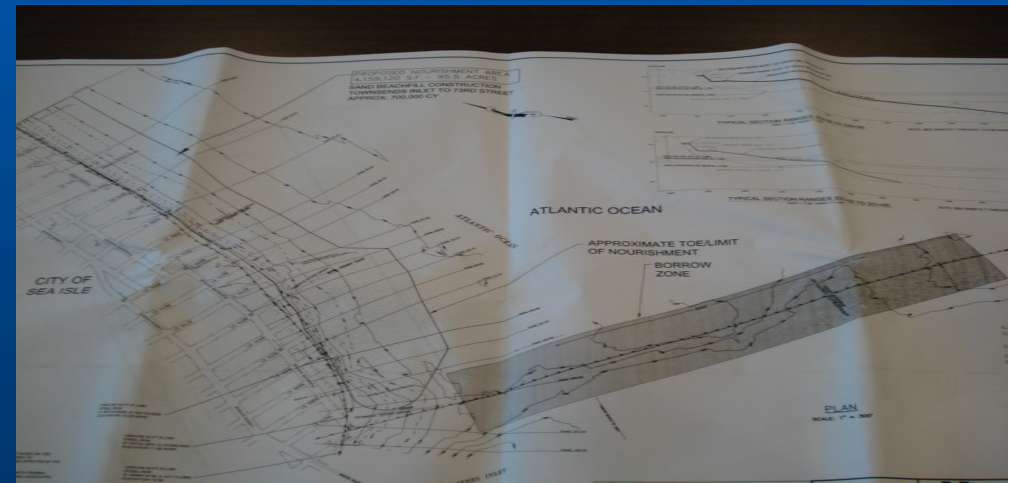


Description

The Project Area

- **The Beach from 73rd Street Southward to 94th Street**
 - This will add protection to the property on the southern end of the Island
- **Beach Profile involves primary and secondary level berms with a gentle slope to match existing contours**
